(China Doll)

China Doll is a relatively new houseplant; it is native to the cool mountain areas of the Philippines, South China and Taiwan. It was brought to Europe in the early 1980's. Typical size seen indoors is 4' by 2' however in its natural environment it can reach to 20' or more. At maturity China Doll has a pure white or cream long tubed flower that is very fragrant.

Water: Keep soil moist with good drainage, does not like being water logged or too dry.

Light: Bright light with no strong sun.

Temperature: Warm temperatures with a minimum temperature of 55 degrees F.

Fertilizer: During the growing season, feed every month with Peters all purpose plant food 20-20-20.

Pests: Watch out for mealy bug and spider mite, to help prevent this it is a good idea to keep the dust off of the leaves. Wash off the leaves occasionally.

Humidity: Can tolerate low humidity.

Tip: To maintain a bushy appearance, keep pinched back.
