



Tillandsia Cyanea (Pink Quill)

Tillandsia Cyanea are a form of epiphyte (air plant) that can also be grown as a terrestrial plant from the bromeliad family. This exotic plant comes from Ecuador and other tropical areas of the world where it is found growing on trees, shrubs, rocks and cliffs. It is one of the most desirable of the tillandsias because of its large blue-violet flowers and deep pink inflorescence. It retains its color for several months.

Light: Give your plant all the sunlight it can take without burning the leaves. A bright window is recommended; place your plants about 12-18 inches back from the window.

Temperature: The Cyanea will do well in a wide range of temperatures, 50-90 degrees F.

Water: Mist plants frequently in the warm months and less often in cool months. If your plant is in soil, water soil approximately 1-2 times per week in the warm months and less often in cooler months.

Fertilizer: Foliar feed your Cyanea with a half strength liquid fertilizer once a month.

Tip: Cyanea require good air circulation. Place them in areas where there is good strong light, air movement, and moist atmosphere. Bright bathrooms and kitchens are best locations.
