



## RHUBARB

Hardy perennial, makes an attractive ornamental in the border or vegetable garden. Large leaves are toxic- use only the fleshy stalks which are pulled (not cut) from the base of the plant.

Rhubarb likes sun (light shade helps in hot areas), rich, deep, well-drained soil and ample water as new growth starts.

Come in today and pick some up!! Two varieties we'll have in stalk at sometime of the year are:

**'Victoria'**- This popular greenish stalked "pie plant" is also excellent for preserves and will produce for up to 20 years with reasonable care. Calculate one to two clumps per family

**Glaskin Perpetual Rhubarb**- A great tart rhubarb, the greenish 12 - 14" stalks never get bitter. Reputed to have the lowest concentration of oxalic acid. Plants grow to 24" tall and are quick to mature. Try combining with strawberries in a dessert soufflé or pie.
